Our retail focus on malls in suburban locations, offers more Singaporeans of different generations a space to build memorable moments together.

All these have been thoughtfully integrated as part of our efforts to bring the concept of a 15-minute city to life, offering an integrated hub where residents can live, work, play – a shared space to appreciate community bonding.

Across our malls in Singapore, we offer a free wheelchair rental service that aims to improve the independent mobility of wheelchair users. Certainly, there is more that we can do. Hence, our focus for

Inclusive Spaces in 2021 on the elderly. Many, as we learn from their sharing, continue to have productive, purposeful and very active lives.

Our efforts to partner the community in co-creating more accessible and enriching real estate spaces do not stop in Singapore.
